## Executive Summary

The aim of the DEMOCRAT project is addressing the challenges facing liberal democracy in Europe. As a research and innovation initiative, the project fits the context of a response to a series of crises that involved the European and global political landscape: the Anthropocene crisis, the COVID-19 pandemic, and the ongoing conflict in Ukraine. The combination of these external shocks and series of internal threats, among which the rise of right-wing extremism, mistrust in scientific research, and the fragmentation of societal consensus, have demonstrated the need to reinforce democratic values and practices across Europe. In this context, the DEMOCRAT project's aim is in fostering democratic resilience by focusing on Education for Democracy (EfD) as a key area of intervention. The complexity of the project's purpose and the broad range of its implications require effective dissemination and exploitation, which is why special care will be devoted to ensuring they planned and executed properly.

One of the focuses of DEMOCRAT is developing and implementing a curriculum framework for responsible democratic competences (RDCs). These competences are essential to nurture informed, active, and responsible citizens, capable to offer their contribution to the preservation and advancement of democratic principles. By cultivating these competences, the project aims to address the root causes of democratic erosion: apathy, misinformation, and the inability to engage in public discourse in a constructive way. The curriculum framework is designed to be adaptable to different educational contexts across Europe, ensuring that it can be effectively integrated into various national education systems.

On a broader scale, the project aligns with Goal 4.7 of the United Nations' 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. This Goal emphasises promoting an education that fosters sustainable development, human rights, gender equality, and global citizenship. Project DEMOCRAT is rooted in the idea that education is not only a tool for personal development, but a critical mechanism to transform society, particularly in the context of democratic governance.

Among Project DEMOCRAT's key components is the implementation of local pilot projects. These projects are designed to test and refine the curriculum framework in an actual, real-world setting. A number of DEMOCRAT's project partners will conduct these pilots in their respective countries and collect a range of diverse data and insights. These will then be used to further develop the curriculum. The selection of pilot sites is strategic: regions that represent different educational challenges and opportunities have been especially selected for this purpose. The aim of these pilots is generating evidence-based practices that can be scaled up and replicated across the European Union and beyond. The insights collected during the Piloting phase will be used to ensure that the curriculum framework is effective and adaptable to different cultural and institutional contexts.

Effective implementation requires not only a robust theoretical framework but also practical resources that can be readily applied in educational settings. This is why, in addition to the curriculum framework and the Pilots, DEMOCRAT will develop a range of tools and resources to support the implementation of Education for Democracy practices. Educators, policymakers, and other stakeholders striving to integrate democratic competences into educational programmes and curricula will find these tools a useful source of support. Materials include training modules, guidelines, and best practice case studies. All of them will be made available to educators and institutions across Europe.

The DEMOCRAT project is led by a consortium of European universities and organisations. Each entity has been selected for its ability to contribute to the initiative with its own resources and expertise. In keeping with the spirit of Democracy, This collaborative approach allows for the pooling of knowledge, experience, and networks across different countries and regions, and it's therefore very important for the success of the Project. The DEMOCRAT Consortium is committed to fostering a culture of cooperation and mutual learning within the project, and to endeavour to do the same in its interactions with external stakeholders. By working together, the partners aim to create a lasting impact on the way democracy is taught and practised in Europe.

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# 1 Introduction

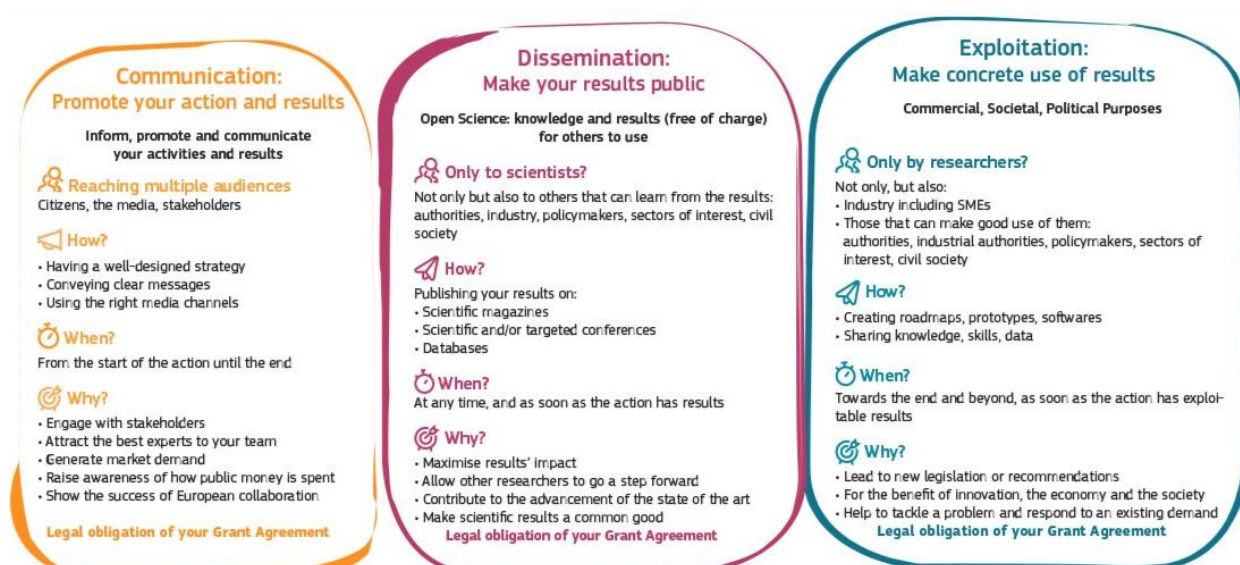
## Project description

EU-society faces four major challenges: the Anthropocene crisis, the pandemic and the Ukraine war and its consequences. All these challenges put at risk the model of liberal democracy, which, of course, has faced similarly internal threats (e.g. political Anthropocene, right wing extremism, mistrust in scientific research and conspirational beliefs) and external critique (questioning whether plural democracy is the best model to affront societal challenges). Education, and especially Education for Democracy (EfD), shall contribute to the defence and enhancement of democracy. This includes the values and principles encompassed within the UN's 2030 Agenda and its Sustainable Development Goals. Goal 4.7, in particular, defines that education should promote sustainable lifestyles, human rights, gender equality, promotion of a culture of peace and non-violence, global citizenship and appreciation of cultural diversity. To reinforce the resilience and sustainability of democracy, DEMOCRAT aims, through a participatory approach, to elaborate curricula for EfD based on a framework of responsible democratic competences (RDCs), to test them in open, local, innovative learning projects and to develop a toolbox to support the development of transformative EfD practices in the EU and beyond. DEMOCRAT's ambitious research and innovation programme will provide insights into the points of comparison and contrast in EfD in the EU-member states, and will develop an innovative curriculum framework linking RDCs with Anthropocene and sustainability. DEMOCRAT will test and analyse pedagogical practices and material considering its effectiveness for acquiring democratic competences and European identity. It will garner insights into the factors influencing the impact of EfD on public participation through the analysis of European datasets, with a particular focus on the relation between socio-economic and educational inequalities and political and social participation.

## 2. Dissemination channels

### Website

The DEMOCRAT website serves as the official hub for the Project-related content and operations. It provides detailed information on the project's objectives, methodologies, consortium partners, and ongoing activities. It also features news updates, events, and resources to engage stakeholders and the broader public in its mission to become a contributing force to education for democracy.

### Social media

After initially agreeing to not create project social media accounts during the first stage of the project, opting instead to use the **#DemocratProject** hashtag when disseminating on their own channels to leverage the national languages represented by the consortium members to facilitate dissemination in languages other than English, the Consortium has determined to open dedicated social media handles to expand the outreach of dissemination activities, structuring them around a common editorial calendar to provide a constant influx of material to be shared and disseminated.

### Agora

Agora is an interactive platform developed as part of the Democrat project to facilitate collaboration, knowledge-sharing, and community engagement. It provides both participants and the broader community with access to a comprehensive range of materials, including videos, blogs, community forums, and a library

of resources. Additionally, the platform hosts the "Democracy Talks" series, featuring recorded lectures by established experts on critical issues related to democracy. Agora is designed to be a central hub for accessing content, connecting with others, and engaging with the ongoing discourse on democratic innovation.

## DEMOCRAT Conferences

### *1<sup>st</sup> DEMOCRAT Conference*

The 1st DEMOCRAT conference in Tallinn, held in Tallin on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> of February 2024, focused on enhancing democratic education across Europe. The event brought together educators, policymakers, and experts to discuss innovative approaches for embedding democratic principles in education, focussing on presenting the Project to a broader audience; introducing the preliminary RDC competence framework and outline of EfD curricula, and involving speakers from outside the project to debate learning programmes for democracy and learning approaches. Key highlights included the importance of critical thinking and media literacy, the role of educators in fostering democratic values, and the need for inclusive, participatory methods in teaching.

### *Final DEMOCRAT Conference*

Evaluation and lessons learnt. The final conference will be devoted to presenting the final RDC framework, the EfD curricula, its relation to national/ regional praxis, the potential impact on learners' competences and democratic processes, main lessons learnt and the toolbox as support for the implementation of transformative EfD in other education settings, including guidelines for embedding EfD in formal education and training systems at national/EU level, and local approaches for learning programmes for democracy.

## Sister Projects

The DEMOCRAT project has established a joint strategy with two sister projects to enhance the communication and dissemination of their collective findings across Europe. Operating under the unified name and hashtag "Education4Democracy," these projects will collaborate closely on both communication efforts and, where applicable, content development. The two additional projects currently involved in the Sister Projects initiative were financed from the same budget as DEMOCRAT. The collaboration is intended a way to maximise reach. As such, it is open to other projects dealing with similar topics.

The "Sister Project" collaboration includes organising public inspiration sessions every 2-3 months. In these sessions, the projects will present their work and receive feedback from external experts. Regular

communication meetings have been scheduled to maintain momentum and coordination. Each project will take turns in managing the joint communication efforts.

To provide a unified platform for sharing information about the projects, a simple WordPress website and a joint logo are also in development. Social media presence will be bolstered through a dedicated LinkedIn page and Twitter/X handle, managed in rotation by the participating projects. The collaboration is open to other EU-funded projects with similar objectives, further broadening the reach and impact of their shared goals.

### 3. Dissemination target groups

#### Education community

DEMOCRAT will develop high activities record in publication of non-academic works on EfD and on democracy in journals oriented to the educators, parents, and other non-academic stakeholders. This is accompanied by participating in events by stakeholders at national and local level. This allows to achieve notable impact in the national and local debate on democracy and EfD finding influential audiences and building up strategic alliances.

#### Children and youth

DEMOCRAT will develop specific communication strategies for children and young people using graphic representation of the research and particularly young people views on democracy and democratic education, potentially in the style of a graphic novel. At the local level, the LPPs include dissemination event for children and young people.

#### Policy makers

DEMOCRAT will pay special attention to another specific audience, the policy makers. This audience requires resumed information, e.g. one-page research overview (maybe an infographic, e.g. Canva) which identifies the policy implications for policy makers. DEMOCRAT will check the possibility to organize policy events at national/regional and transnational level, which includes the participation of children and young people giving them voice to be heard in matters that affect them (see Lundy 2007).

#### Academia

DEMOCRAT will develop high activities record in publication academic work EfD and on democracy achieving notable achievements in science publications and impacts in the debate on democracy and EfD at national and international level. Democrat will put a special focus on publication in national languages to achieve all stakeholders especially teachers and social educators, considering that main part of education debates are hold in national languages. This publication activities include publication of peer-review articles in international and national journals, edited books with case studies from each context with contribution from researchers and practitioners; events (participating in and organizing); lectures; workshops. This guarantees the research outputs will find influential audiences and lead to R&I advances.

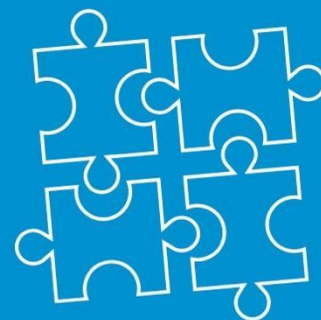

# Illustrations

The color palette sets a visual tone for the project's brand. Colors can also create a strong brand recall when it is associated with your brand.

## Color palette guidelines

- Create a primary palette and limit it to up to four colors.
- Note which is the main color.
- A secondary color palette may be used to complement the primary palette but never to substitute.
- Consistent use is important.

# Typography

Having a signature font contributes to a strong brand. It is considered as a visual component and should be consistent throughout.

## Typography guidelines

- Select a font for the logo and heading
- Select a font each for subheadings and body font. Note that these fonts can be the same, but can vary in size or style.
- Assign a standard size for the use of each
- Keep fonts simple and clean
